I have continued to pop in to the summer program counselor meetings, as well as attend the luncheon for all our staff and young adults who have worked in Radburn this summer. A great opportunity to thank all who have worked hard this season.

Some reminders for Radburn members: Please be sure to have your Real estate agent, or yourself - contact the office prior to your closing on the sale of your home so that we can be sure that the new owner gets the proper documentation they need for their closing.

Also – any exterior modifications must be submitted with an architectural application to the office – BEFORE you begin any projects. This includes tree removals. We ask that you install the Radburn permit in your window once your application has been approved when you are doing exterior projects at your home. We also need to know that the Borough permits are being applied for as well - where required.

A few residents have contacted the office recently to tell us that they are seeing rodents in our parks and on Radburn property. Utility work and construction that has been occurring in the borough can disturb nests and cause rodents to re-locate.
