



Pool Rules 2021 during COVID-19

All rules and regulations are subject to change based on State and Borough guidelines regarding Covid-19 (As of May 12th, 2021)

Due to Covid-19, all residents must sign a waiver absolving The Radburn Association of its responsibility for entering the pool facilities. Also, each resident must sign and acknowledge that they have read and will adhere to all the following rules and regulations. **THESE FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED BY EACH ADULT (18 AND OVER) RESIDENT THAT PLANS TO USE THE POOL AT ANY TIME THIS SUMMER PRIOR TO THE POOL OPENING FOR THE SEASON.**

Due to Covid protocols, The Radburn Association must limit capacity to a number that ensures all individuals or groups of people can remain six feet apart. The capacity of R pool is 35 people and B pool is 65 people. We will not have sign ups during the week, but if we see that capacity becomes an issue, we will add a sign up process. If the pool reaches capacity any resident who would like to enter the facility will have to wait until another one leaves. The social ambassador and Gate guard will monitor capacity as well as entrance and exits. You may wait outside of the pool area for availability to open up. If you download the CellBadge app to your phone, you can see if the pool has reached capacity. On the weekends there will be 2 sessions. Sessions will be split by odd and even house numbers. A schedule will be sent and will alternate. If the association finds, as the summer progresses, that capacity is not being met these sessions will be removed.

NO GUESTS WILL BE ALLOWED THIS YEAR DUE TO COVID-19

If social distancing rules change throughout the summer to allow us larger capacity limits, this rule may be removed, but our first priority is to ensure that residents have as much access to the pools as possible.

Entering and Exiting Pool Area and General Rules.

During authorized and supervised times, to enter the Pool Area all persons must have registered with CellBadge or have a valid Pool ID Card; A waiver and acknowledgement of pool rules must be filed with the office prior to the start of the season.

Pool ID Cards will not be collected. Residents must show their pool ID card to the gate guard EVERY time they enter the pool area.

Only one resident or family shall check in at the gate at a time. All others should wait outside the gate on the designated lines practicing social distancing until the prior resident is done.

All residents and their family (except children under the age of 2) must wear a mask or face covering upon entering and leaving the pool area for the safety of the pool staff. Masks are encouraged at the pool deck.

All staff will have temperature checks prior to entering the pool area. Any employee with a temperature over 100.4 will NOT be admitted to the pool area.

Upon entering the pool area please find a designated spot to set up yourself and/or your family so you can maintain at least 6 feet between other residents.

People may be in the pool only when a certified lifeguard is on duty and swimming is permitted.

Please maintain social distancing of 6 feet in the pool. DO NOT CONGREGATE in groups unless they are immediate family members.

All people must follow lifeguard instructions at all times.

Glass containers are prohibited in the Pool Area.

No food or drink (other than water) is allowed in the Pool Area - residents may set up and eat outside the pool gates and in the park, but please continue to abide by social distancing standards.

No smoking or vaping is permitted in the Pool Area.

No bicycles, tricycles, skateboards, or similar are permitted in the Pool Area.

No animals (except service animals) are permitted in the Pool Area.

No one who is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or appears to be so, will be admitted to the Pool Area.

All people must shower before entering the pool.

All people should clean their feet in the outdoor shower before entering the pool.

No one is permitted in the Pool Area other than at authorized and supervised times; any violation is considered TRESPASS and can be prosecuted.

No one will be admitted to the Pool Area if the posted Maximum Occupancy has been reached. Due to covid-19, maximum occupancy will be adjusted based on State and Borough guidelines as well as the square footage of the deck and pool to ensure that social distance protocols can be observed. (35 people at R Pool, 65 people at B Pool).

No ball playing on the Pool deck area.

We highly encourage you to bring your own chair or blanket.

Use benches at your own risk.

Please bring your own water bottle. DO NOT use water fountains unless refilling a reusable bottle.

When the lifeguard blows the whistle and announces pool closing, everyone must exit the pool and gather their belongings. DO NOT CONGREGATE. Leave the pool area immediately.

There will be NO lost and found this season. Any items that are left will be disposed of.

FOOTWEAR and ATTIRE

No footwear worn outside of the Pool Area is allowed in the pool, including “water shoes”

As per state protocols, Footwear MUST be worn in the bathrooms

All people entering a pool must wear swimwear (items specifically designed for swimming); no street clothes or similar are allowed. Reasonable observance of religious requirements (covering up for modesty) will be allowed. Cut-offs, shorts, t-shirts, and similar are allowed in the Pool Areas but strictly prohibited in the pool.

HEALTH

No person who has any of the following is allowed in the pool area:

Skin disease/rash/sores; eye or ear sores/discharge; open cuts or abrasions.

Diarrhea or similar gastrointestinal distress in the past 7 days.

Due to Covid 19, no one with a recurring coughing, sneezing or a fever symptom will be admitted to the Pool Area. Please refer to CDC guidelines for signs and symptoms of Covid-19.

Due to Covid- 19, face masks must be worn upon entering and exiting the pool area. Masks are encouraged, but not required on the pool deck as long as social distance rules are adhered to. **DO NOT WEAR MASKS IN THE POOL. LIFEGUARDS ON ACTIVE DUTY WILL NOT BE WEARING MASKS.**

Please always dispose of masks, gloves and garbage properly in the trash cans provided. This is for the safety of all residents and staff.

If minor first aid is needed, pool staff will provide bandages, ice etc... , but the resident or parent must apply any needed first aid.

If you or a member of your family are not feeling well, please advise the pool attendant and leave the pool area immediately or ask for assistance or medical attention if needed. The pool staff will contact 911 if necessary.

If you or a family member, have symptoms or are diagnosed with Covid-19 within 2 weeks of using the pool facilities please contact the office immediately. The Fair Lawn health department will be notified by the office staff. All HIPPA laws will be adhered to in notifying the community if necessary.

INFANTS and TODDLERS

Regular diapers are NOT permitted in the pools at any time; only swim diapers with appropriate cover ups are allowed.

Any child who is not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper in the water.

Please immediately report any 'accidents' in the pool to a lifeguard or attendant.

Children should not have their clothing or diapers changed in the Pool Area.

SAFETY

No running is allowed on the pool deck. No rough play is allowed in the pool.

Sports or ball playing will NOT be allowed in the pool this season.

Diving is only allowed in the deep diving well of the pool.

Use of approved life jackets are allowed only in the baby pool and the shallow ends of the pools. Sleeve flotation devices (worn on the arms only) are permitted only in the baby pool. Approved Life jackets and flotation devices (for safety only) must not be shared with non-family members.

NO flotation devices (rafts, tubes, etc...) will be allowed in the pool. Pool noodles and any pool toys may not be shared. Balls will not be allowed in the pool this year.

Residents must bring their own pool noodles for aquasize and must not share.

Please DO NOT share goggles or masks. DO NOT leave goggles or masks on the pool deck where another resident may touch or step on it. Snorkels are prohibited this season.

Please maintain social distancing on the pool deck at all times. There should be a minimum of 6ft between individuals or families.

BATHROOMS

During Covid-19, use bathrooms at your own risk.

Footwear MUST be worn in the bathroom at all times.

Only one person in the bathroom at a time unless you are helping someone in your immediate family. Please be sure to wash your hands for a minimum of 20 seconds (follow all CDC guidelines for proper hygiene) and wipe down all areas after use.

DEEP WATER SWIM TEST

Children between the ages of 8 and 13 years can swim in the deep end by demonstrating the following proficiencies (testing to be done by a specified lifeguard at specified times posted on the Radburn Website and Bulletin):

Tread water for at least 2 minutes

Competently swim 25 meters (the length of B pool) with acceptable breathing techniques

Jump into the pool from deep well pool deck and swim to a ladder

Generally demonstrate the ability to safely be in deeper water

A parent or Guardian must accompany the child at the test. Only two children will be allowed to test at one time, while others must remain outside the gate while observing social distance.

Children 13 and under that have passed the deep-water test will receive a wristband and may be in the deep diving well of the pool area unaccompanied. Please bring and wear your wristband every time you come to the pool. If the wrist band is shared with a resident that has not passed the test, all deep-water privileges will be revoked.

Children 8 and over, **THAT HAVE PASSED THE DEEP WATER TEST**, may be in the pool area unaccompanied by an adult. They must be wearing their wristband at all times.

WEATHER

No swimming during, and for at least 30 minutes after, any thunder or severe weather, and the lifeguard reopens the pool

Contact a lifeguard or pool attendant in case of emergency.

The lifeguards, and pool managers have the express authority to remove anyone from the Pool Area for violating any of these items or for behaving in an unsafe or disorderly manner. Violation of these rules can lead to suspension of pool privileges and other actions by the Association. All regulations stated in the Governor's Executive Order #153, #157, #230 and the Department of Health's Executive Directive 20-022 and Covid-19 Pools and Aquatic Recreation Facility Standards are enforceable by law and must be strictly adhered to. **IF RULES AND REGULATIONS ARE NOT ADHERED TO, THE BOARD AND MANAGEMENT HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO CLOSE THE POOLS FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE SEASON.**
